### About Guringai Festival

Founded in 2001, the Guringai Festival aims to raise awareness of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people living in northern Sydney. 2006 marks the 6th consecutive year the Guringai Festival has been running.

The Festival promotes friendship, reconciliation and a shared love for the land, our Guringai land – our home.

The Aboriginal people who reside in the northern Sydney region come from many different Aboriginal nations or countries throughout Australia and call this place – Guringai Country – home.

The theme for this year's Festival is Corroboree, Culture, Community.

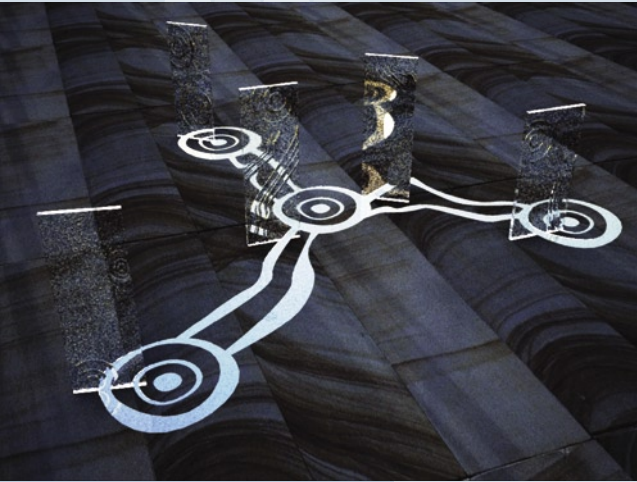
The Guringai Festival is our Modern Day Corroboree, a celebration and gathering of Aboriginal Heritage and Culture.
